## **REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION:**

Parents/guardian's current Michigan driver's license or Michigan state ID

If you are acting as the student's guardian, you must provide proof of guardianship.

- Two of the following current proofs (within past 30 days) with your name and address:
  - o Gas, electric, phone, water, cable and/or property tax bill
  - Rent receipt
  - Formal signed lease/rental agreement
  - Verification of tenants through management of rental unit
  - Closing statement of the domicile (home)
  - Mortgage payment book or monthly mortgage statement
  - Home/renters insurance statement
  - Paycheck indicating home address
  - Official letter from DHS/Social Security verifying home address
- Birth certificate (must be translated into English), passport, visa or green card
- Up-to-date immunization records
- Most recent report card
- Transcript for grades 10-12
- Recent IEP, if applicable



## Schedule

Before starting on the first day of school, each student must ensure that he/she has a course schedule. A student might have more than one teacher and more than one classroom. Also, If a student's schedule contains the courses that were requested or includes alternate courses which were selected, there is nothing additional that the student has to do! Students should not request a change of schedule unless the schedule meets one of the criteria below. Criteria for Schedule Changes:

- Enrolling in a course to meet graduation requirements
- Adjusting a schedule to accommodate placement into Co-Op, Vocational Class, Dual Enrollment, etc.
- Enrolled in a previously failed course with the instructor who issued the failing grade
- Computer error (two classes the same hour or incomplete schedule)

Students should email their counselor with schedule concerns.

All requests for schedule adjustment MUST be accompanied with a signed note by the parent or guardian approving the change. This note must be in the student's possession at the time of the appointment with the counselor.

All schedule adjustments are subject to approval by the counselor and the building principal.

## Homework policy and purpose

Each high school teacher will share his course specific information in the **syllabus**. Syllabus will include grading policy, homework, and discipline policy, as well as a course description. Adhering to these policies will boost the student's achievement and success.

For elementary and middle school, teachers usually send newsletters home, so make sure to check your student's backpack on a daily basis for any important information (field trips, permission slips, homework, report cards, etc.).

Homework prepares students for classroom instruction and acts as a stimulus for new learning. It enhances classroom instruction through the practice, application, and reinforcement of learning in order to extend knowledge and skills. It also assists students in understanding and reviewing classwork, improves the understanding of key curricular skills and concepts, and assesses if these skills and concepts have been mastered. Completion of assignments helps students to develop good study skills, work habits, and research skills by promoting personal responsibility, time management, and independent thinking. It develops critical thinking skills, enables higher levels of thinking, and fosters creativity. Homework also provides opportunities for parents to become an integral part of their child's daily learning and promotes communication between the school and home.

# **Bus Transportation**

Transportation is available to many HPS students to and from school. Riding a school bus:

BUS STOP TIMES: Your child's route will be assigned an approximate pick up and drop off time. This time may change. The first week times vary quite a bit, after the first two weeks things settle down into a routine. Be aware that weather, road construction, and traffic can alter times.
BUS STOP: Show your child where the bus stop is and how to walk home from the bus stop. Show them from all possible directions. Students often become confused when they approach a stop from a different direction.

WRONG BUS: Teach your child to tell the bus driver if they believe they are on the wrong bus. Teach the student what to do if they get off at the wrong stop or if someone is not home when they arrive. Students should never attempt to walk to another area. Make sure your student knows they should walk directly home. We get many calls about missing children who simply stop to play at a neighbor's house on their way home from the bus stop.

Parents, please review the following rules with your children. They are important for our students' safety and for maintaining bus-riding privileges.

- 1. Observe classroom conduct.
- 2. Be courteous, use no profane language.
- 3. Do not eat or drink on the bus.
- 4. Keep the bus clean.
- 5. Cooperate with the driver.
- 6. Do not smoke.
- 7. Do not damage the bus or equipment.



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- 8. Stay in your seat.
- 9. Keep head, hands and feet inside the bus.
- 10. Do not fight, push or shove.
- 11. Do not tamper with bus equipment.
- 12. Do not bring pets on the bus.
- 13. Do not bring flammable material on the bus.
- 14. The bus driver is authorized to assign seats.
- 15. Have a safe trip.

child's teacher find ways to work together to ensure your child's success.

Parents, please attend all the important events at your children's schools. There is a correlation between parent involvement and students' success. Make sure to attend Back to School Night, Orientations, parent-teachers conferences and all other important events at school. We need your support!



# After-school clubs and sports options

All schools provide various opportunities to participate in various clubs and sports. These offerings differ from school to school. Please make sure to visit your school's web site or contact the main office at your school to find information on the most recent clubs and sports offerings.

## **Special Services**

The Hamtramck Department of Special Services is responsible for providing services to children with disabilities ages 0-26 years of age. If appropriate, interventions and support can occur as early as birth and last throughout a child's educational career. For more information about the program eligibility, please refer to the following resource. It is also attached to this packet for your convenience.

#### **Summer school**

The Newcomer Summer Program runs from June 23rd-August 5th. All eligible newcomers are encouraged to apply. The classes are conducted four days a week, M-Th 8:30-1:00. The program is specifically designed for recent immigrant students with limited English language proficiency. It provides intensive instruction in a special academic environment.





## The role of guidance counselors

School Counselors strive to make each student feel that there is someone in the school who knows and cares about them. Above all else school counselors are advocates for students. School Counselors achieve these goals by providing a variety of services to the students; these services include, but are not limited to the following:

- Emotional, social, developmental and behavioral services to students and families.
- Academic guidance and support services, including the monitoring of academic performance, scheduling classes, facilitating communication between school and home.
- Career awareness, exploration and planning services, including goal setting and decision making assistance for students.
- School crisis and intervention referral services.
- Individual Counseling, Small Group Counseling, Social Groups
- Teacher/Parent Consultation
- Referral Assistance

Counselors work closely with both students and their families. Parents are encouraged to contact counselors with questions, concerns, or to gather feedback on their child's progress at school.

#### Using a locker

Students are to keep their personal belongings in the lockers which are assigned to them. Valuables should not be kept in lockers. Students are responsible for safeguarding their personal property. The school cannot be responsible for replacing lost or stolen property. Every student

who uses a locker must have a combination lock on it provided by the school. Combinations and lockers should not be shared with anyone other than the assigned locker partner. Students found using/sharing a locker other than the one assigned to them will be subject to disciplinary action. All locks should be registered with the seminar teacher. Any unregistered locks will be removed.



## Using a school provided planner

The planner serves as a communication tool for students, parents and teachers. As students, you should use this book daily to write down all assignments, messages, projects, etc. As parents, you should review your child's planner daily to become familiar with his/her academic work and to help your child monitor daily and future assignments.

# **Preparing for field trips**

Are you excited about the upcoming field trip? Make sure that your parents signed the permission slip. Only your parents and legal guardians can sign their names on it. Return a permission slip to your teacher. There are due dates that must be honored. If you return your slip too late, you might not be allowed to go because everything is already planned ahead (number of students on the bus, chaperones, food, etc.).





## What to do in emergency drills

All Michigan public schools are required to conduct safety drills throughout the school year to ensure students and staff are well-prepared in the event of an emergency. During an emergency drill, a student must follow the school's procedures and remain respectful, quiet, and obedient to teachers commands while evacuating/relocating to the designated outside stations.
